

The Matching Scholarship Program

Supporting and guiding students in their efforts to raise financial support through scholarships, grants, and gifts

Overview

lliff's Matching Scholarship Program provides direct assistance to students who are willing to actively fundraise for expenses related to their own education.

For the 2017-2018 academic year, students may receive up to \$4,500 in matching funds.

Specific program requirements include:

- Completing one-on-one coaching regarding the availability of matching funds, guidelines and restrictions about funding sources, and effective approaches to fundraising.
- Submission of a short **Fundraising Plan** indicating how the student plans to approach potential funding sources.
- Intentional, personal efforts toward identifying potential **funding sources**, and approaching those sources regarding financial support.

Some restrictions apply in terms of sources. For example, funds may be received (but not matched) from: employers; partners, spouses, and family members; lliff staff, faculty & trustees; and other students. Sources which require applications by the student are generally eligible for matching funds.

How You Can Help

Friends, colleagues, and churches (or other organizations) can provide support for students by:

- Becoming **active partners** with them as they progress toward their educational goals, helping them to discern their ministry or leadership path.
- Directly providing financial support through grants, scholarships, or gifts, or helping with fundraising events. Qualifying funding sources range from large (i.e. denominational scholarship or grant programs) to small (individual donors), and everything in between.
- Assisting students as they seek to discover other potential funding sources which might not be immediately clear, including philanthropic organizations or individuals who might support the future leadership goals of the student.
- Helping potential sources understand the sacrifices being made by students pursuing graduate education for ministry or nonprofit leadership, and the challenges of repaying burdensome student debt on limited future salaries.
- Helping students **understand the realities** of future income in their ministry work.
